## **1. Purpose**

This document intends to provide guidance on the content of an IDoW Policy. The CBE takes due cognizance of the characteristics of each built environment profession; and therefore foresees that the IDoW Policies of each CBEP will demonstrate features addressing the unique requirements of that profession.

## **2. Background**

The Council for the Built Environment (the CBE) developed an Identification of Work Policy. (The Policy). The Policy emphasises the mandate of the six councils for the built environment professions (the CBEP) to regulate their respective professions. It is expected that each CBEP should adopt an identification of work policy (IDoW Policy) as part of a suite of policies directed towards the regulation of professions.

## **3. The Proposed Minimum Content of the CBEP's IDoW Policies**

It is proposed that the CBEP's IDoW Policies should, as a minimum, contain sections addressing the following matters.

1. Purpose
2. Background
3. Problem statement
4. Scope or application of the policy
5. Other policies effecting/effectuated by this policy
6. Key requirements of regulatory mechanisms
7. Mechanisms to enhance entrance into professions
  - a. Special Consent
  - b. Limited Special Dispensation
  - c. Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)
  - d. Candidacy
  - e. Transitional arrangements
8. Guidelines on persons performing identified work whilst registered as a candidate or unregistered but in a specified relationship with a registered person taking responsibility for any work so performed.
9. A guideline on how to deal with overlaps in identified work
10. Mechanisms to protect the use of professional titles
11. Monitoring of application of the policy
12. Dispute resolution mechanisms
13. Review of the policy
